 - Popular View (Right Circle):**
 - National hero of the Philippines
 - A womanizer during his time
 - He is the writer of Noli Me Tangere and El Filibusterismo
 - He was killed by the Spaniards in Luneta park
 - He is in front of the one peso coin
 - He symbolizes nationalism and patriotism
 - He fought a silent war rather than a bloody war against Spaniard
 - He is smart and studied in multiple prestigious university
 - He fought against the Spaniards and inspired Filipinos to fight
