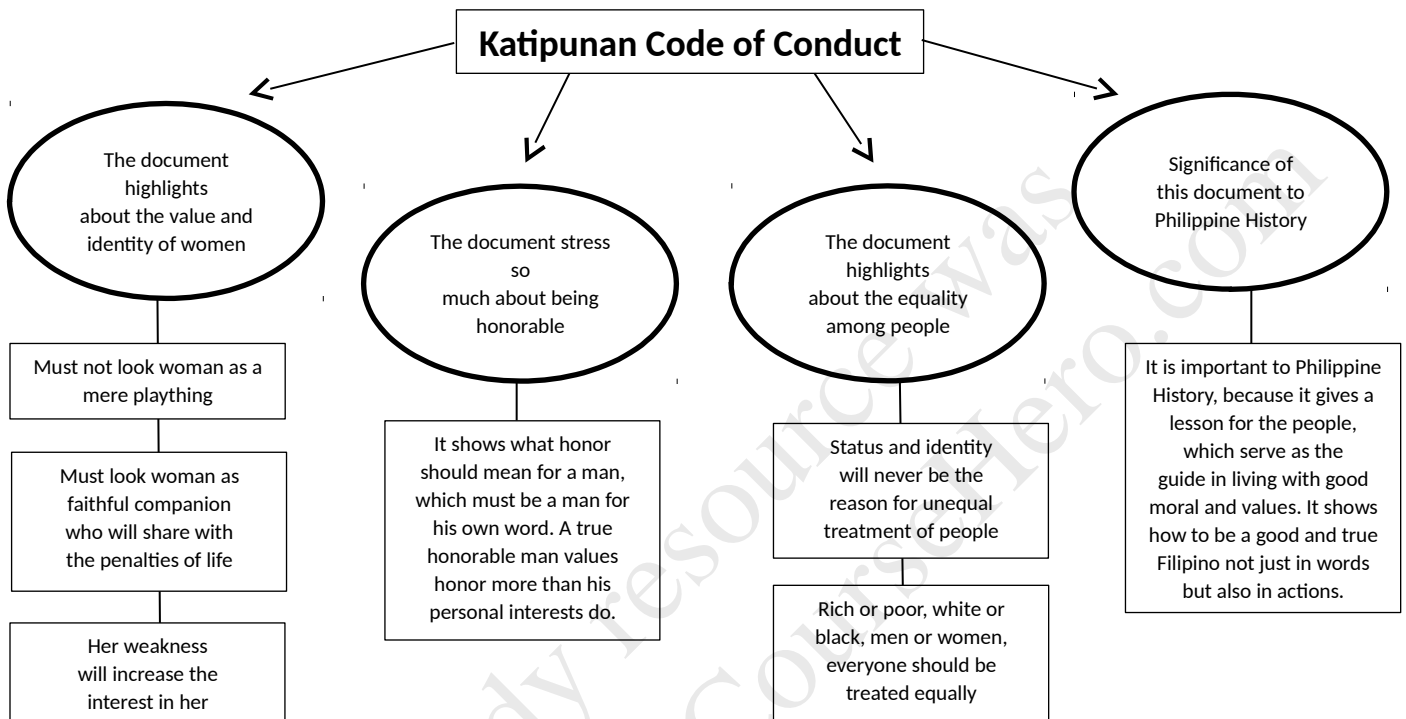
2. List down the names of the ranks of the Katipunan.

Guide Questions:

1. How does Bonifacio describe love for the country? Explain.
2. Pick two or three stanzas that you relate with your love for the country. Explain why you relate to these stanzas.
3. What is the importance of this literary work to Philippine History?

The poem “Pag-ibig Sa Tinubuang Bayan” (Love of Country) by Andres Bonifacio was his passionately written work as a part of his contributions to awakened Filipinos from their ill-fated conditions back then. Bonifacio describe love for the country based on his life experiences among fellow Filipinos. He wrote about his love for the country for his sentiment about the Filipinos. He makes Filipinos realized that there is no other country for them but only the Philippines. He describe that Filipinos should appreciate and love their own country more than anyone and anything else. Like what Bonifacio did, he never stopped showing his love and patriotism to his Mother country of one’s birth. Through this, Bonifacio further asserted- implicitly that nationalism must come from within and not from elsewhere, because nationalism is inherent and untapped. That is why he was offended to see why it was difficult for Filipinos to show it, especially that it was taught to them.

After reading the poem, there are two stanzas that I can relate with my love for the country, which are the fourth and fifth stanzas. “Love of the country is always the desire of a man with honor; in songs, in poetry, in his writings the greatness of the country is always the theme.” I can relate with this stanza, since I’m the type of a person who appreciates the literary works of Filipinos, I also love listening composed songs and writing poems using deep/native Filipino languages/dialects. I also appreciates books with greatness about our country as a theme. The second one is “Nothing dear to a person with a pure heart is denied to the country that gave him birth: blood, wealth, knowledge, sacrifices, even if life itself ends.” I can also relate with this stanza, because I am a proud pure Filipina, I am proud that I was born in this beautiful country, there is no other country for me but only the Philippines.

This literary works is significant to the Philippine history, because it gives reflections from past to present, it helps us to create and build our own thoughts to learned histories of thoughts and expressions. This will lead us to understand the history and enhance our understanding in the present situation. It will also serve as an eye-opener for those people who forget to look back where they first started.
