Destination 1: Calle Crisologo

It has looked over the town of both Bantay and Vigan for centuries, and was known as Diego and Gabriela Silang's favorite date spot during the 17th century. Destination 3: Baluarte Resort and Mini Zoo

Tour Guide: Dubbed as the Home of The Big Cats in Vigan.
